## Our Learning this Week

Year R children will now work on the letter sounds of i, n, m, d; thinking about words which start with these sounds (igloo, nut, mum and dad as examples). As last week, any practical sorting or I Spy games at home with these sounds will be really useful. We will be sending home a Sounds Book this week, which can be used to build words using velcro letter cards. These books will need returning each Wednesday so we can update them with the sounds each week. In the past, a parent helper has donated some time to help prepare this resource. Please come and find Miss France or myself if you are able to offer 45 minutes of your time on a weekly basis. Year 1 children will continue over-learning the trickier vowel phonemes, along with focusing on reading real and nonsense words. In English we will continue to work on poetry, making links with autumn and harvest time. Year R children will be writing labels using their letter sound knowledge, and Year 1 children will be writing descriptive phrases to create their own poetry. In maths we will be looking at numerals on number lines and number tracks, and identifying errors within a number sequence. Our school has a large focus on developing the children's reasoning skills from an early age, so we will be getting the children to explain how they know something is wrong, drawing on the language of more, fewer, less, in between.
