Year R children will be taking part in a nursery rhyme challenge this term, to help develop not only their speaking skills, but also their understanding of rhyming and rhythmic patterns within language. Our Learning this Week

Year R will now work on the letter sounds of h, b, l and f this week; thinking about words which start with these sounds (hen, bat, log and fed as examples). They will also find out about II, ss and ff at the end of a word, such as in hill, kiss and Biff. All children will take part in sharing their holiday news, and have a go at writing this into a simple sentence. Year 1 will be building their sentence skills to include the use of "and" in a sentence, but will need to ensure they have the correct use of capital letters and full stops in their writing too. We will also be looking at firework poetry towards the end of the week. Year R will learn a poem by heart - hopefully they can come home and perform it you over the weekend! Year 1 will extend their understanding of poetry by looking for rhyming words and adjectives in the text. Any kitchen / toilet tubes will be useful this week and next for some firework making craft, please. In maths we will be thinking about how groups of items can be combined to show simple addition, using the language of how many altogether, and what is the total? Year 1 will link this learning to number bond facts which make 10, and Year R will be using practical resources to find the total amount. Feel free to help at home by adding two groups of items, using the language mentioned above to talk through the process with your child. You may also like to play: https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/mental-mathstrain, then select Addition up to 10 for Year R, or Bonds to make 10 for Year 1. Our worship theme this week is centred upon celebrating songs of praise through the Bible. We will also welcome some visitors from The Family Trust into school for a whole school worship assembly, which will be attended by Year R for the first time.
