The children will need lunch as usual - but you may wish to provide a slightly smaller lunch, as we know from previous years they enjoy eating the party food in the afternoon! Our Learning this Week

This week we will start lots of festive and winter themed work - we have 3 Nativity performances, which will add to the excitement of the run up to Christmas. However, we will still take part in English and maths learning, making links with the festive period where possible. In English, we will be writing letters to Father Christmas in our neatest style of handwriting. Year 1 children will be encouraged to use "because" in their sentence to give a good reason as to why they would like a particular gift. We will also be writing instruction for festive biscuits, which the children will make in class. In maths, we will continue to work on the area of number sequences, with Year R solving missing numbers in a track, and Year 1 developing their reasoning and problem solving skills linked to worded problems involving counting in 2s and 5s. We will link our number problems to Christmas, for example, there were 4 animals in the barn, each with 2 eyes. How many eyes altogether? Feel free to join in at home with worded number problems. A fun way of solving them is by drawing pictures to help explain the answers. Our worship theme this week will be centred upon Christmas, focusing on traditions and how we remember the birth of Jesus.
