We use the outdoor area not only to develop a range of physical skills, but also quite often for active phonics, word and number learning, along with our normal outdoor playtimes, too. Role-Play Area Update

Thank you for your kind words about our Pudding Lane bakery role-play area. The children have really enjoyed using it to link with their topic learning. This week the children will be making salt dough items of food to use in their bakery, which we are sure they will enjoy doing. Feel free to let us know if you have anything else which you think may be useful. Huge thanks go to Fabian's family for the loan of the scales, the sand timer and relics from English history - the children really enjoyed finding out about them last week, and they give a real sense of history.

Our Learning this Week

This week we will introduce the sounds of th and ng to our Year R children, for example, in the words this, that, and sing. Please remember to return the Sound Books for all children so that we can get them updated with their next set of letter tiles. We hope you are still finding time to use this

resource, as it is a really useful way of building both real and nonsense words. In English lessons this week we will continue to make links with the Great Fire of London, writing both a diary entry as a simple recount of the events, along with a fire report.

Year 1 will be encouraged to use descriptive language in their sentences, helping to build confidence with their use of adjectives. In maths we will continue to learn about time, thinking this week about how a clock is used to tell the time in o'clock and half past, and for some children quarter past the hour, too. Year 1 will be matching worded times to pictures of clock faces, along with drawing their own clocks to match given times. Year R will be familiarising themselves with the layout of a clock, and we will also use it in playing "What's the Time, Mr Wolf?" to help with accurate counting of footsteps, too. Feel free to play along at home, or use any new watches the children have recently received to help with telling the time.
