This week

As we are going to visit Drusillas on Wednesday, much of our learning will be around this – both in preparation for the trip and then following up on what we have learnt.

We will also be completing our work on senses in Science, this week focussing on hearing. In Topic we will be having a visit from Mrs. Ashworth, we will asking her questions about how Collier Street has changed over time.

Thursday: New Intake into Reception

On Thursday all new Year Rs will be visiting Russet Classroom for a whole day. The current Year R children, who will be staying in Russet Class, will also spend the day in Russet; meeting Miss O'Connor and being role models for the younger children.

Whilst this is happening, the remainder of Russet Class will be working in The Orchard Room – this is all the children who will be moving along to Pippins (both current Year R and Year 1). They will be working with Ms. Findlay in the morning and then Mrs. Bannon in the afternoon. At 8.55, when the bell goes please can these children <u>line up on the playground</u>. At the end of the school day the children can be collected from the main back entrance of the school (near the toilets).
