From September 2020, all schools will be delivering a revised PSHE curriculum which includes for the first time, relationship education. There is also a separate section on mental well-being. As a school, we have been working on the implementation of this valuable addition to the curriculum and consequently would like to mark Children's Mental Health Week which takes place from the 3rd February. The theme is Find your Brave. Life is all about taking small brave steps every day. Bravery could be about sharing worries and asking for help when you need it, trying something new or making the right choices. As part of the week, there's a wear something vellow day.
