### A busy week

Last week felt like the 'good old days' in school! We were able to welcome numerous visitors, held special events and ran parent/ teacher consultations. I hope you found these informative. We are planning to hold the next consultations at the end of February.

On Monday I launched antibullying week in worship with a theme this year of 'One Kind Word'. Over the week, all children took part in a range of activities to reinforce the importance of respect and building good relationships with peers.

To begin, children were encouraged to think about what kindness means and what it looks like. They reflected on times when others had shown kindness to them and how it made them feel. It was soon clear that a small act of kindness or even just one positive word can make you smile and feel good. As a result of this, Bramley Class wrote messages of kindness and thanks to each member of staff. These were gratefully received and resulted in lots of smiles. During the week, a wide range of activities took place across the school including tackling the misconceptions of bullying, understanding the impact and the importance of creating a happy supportive environment where everyone feels valued. In Pippin Class, a wreath of kindness was made, sharing positive words and acts that would brighten up anyone's day. Children thought carefully about the feelings of others and the importance of good friendships. Russet Class have shared a range of picture books and discussed messages of friendship, similarities and differences between people. One of their particular favourites was, 'Super Duper You', by Sophy Henn. Discovery Class worked together to create an amazing and striking display offering kind words and thoughts to all members of the school.
