Preparing for Winter...

We have now been informed of the price increases for our energy. As a Kent school we have been fortunate to have extremely low prices but the current 18 month contract ended last Friday. We are facing huge increases; the electricity which makes up about 70% of our total energy consumption will increase by 66%. The gas is considerably more. It goes without saying that unless we wish to use an additional £9000 of our budget on energy, we are going to have to find cost savings. We are going to trial various ideas but it's probably going to lead to the school being a lower temperature than in previous years, although last year was pretty cool as we had to have so much ventilation for Covid! Please ensure children come to school with a cardigan/jumper every day. When the cold weather really bites, an extra layer (t-shirt under a shirt/polo shirt for example) could well be advantageous.
