Online Safety

In a recent safeguarding update from the Safeguarding Advisory Service, they shared information about Internet Matters who have produced new 'ABC checklists' for parents focusing on 3 key areas to guide you through the basics of keeping children safe online.

These are;

Activate parental controls. This includes guidance and links to setting up parental controls, filters,

privacy and security settings on a variety of devices and platforms.

Balance screen time. Provides tips and advice to help parents manage their child's screen time and encourages families to find a balance with offline activities.

Check and chat. Encourages you to check in with your child regularly and communicate with them about the things they see and do online.

Nurture

This term we have set up a Nurture group for a small group of pupils. The aim of the group is to enable children to be ready to learn and maximize their potential. A Nurture group can help to develop children's emotional literacy, language development and communication as well as developing and emotional well being and selfesteem. These in turn support children with academic achievement; ultimately the Nurture group is a place of learning.

This group is run by 2 trained members of staff, two afternoons a week in the Garden Room. Each session is planned carefully and has a predictable pattern. Each session involves a check in with emotions (using the Zones of Regulation), a creative or cookery activity, and a time to eat and drink together.
