Following on from my last update, I can confirm that it is our intention that provision from 7.45–8.45am and 3.15–6.00pm will be in place by September 2025 at the latest. SEN Provision in Kent

The formal notice for Kent County Council (KCC) to improve services for children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) has been lifted by the government. This development follows the news that a formal monitoring visit in April 2024 found "sustainable improvements" were being made by the local area in all nine areas of weakness identified in the 2022 inspection. *This is indeed good news.*
